It hosted a Ramadan event at the Jat House restaurant in New Jersey, inviting prominent Syrian-American businessmen and doctors residing in New York and Philadelphia from diverse backgrounds to join the iftar. The event brought together social figures from Syria, Egypt, Pakistan, the United States, and various countries in Asia and Africa.

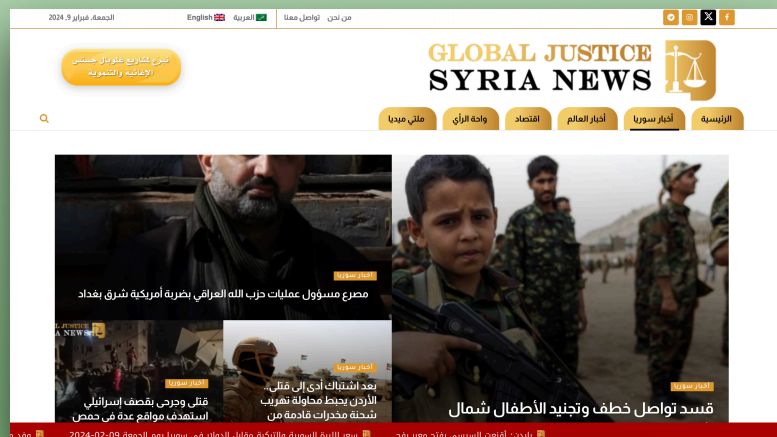
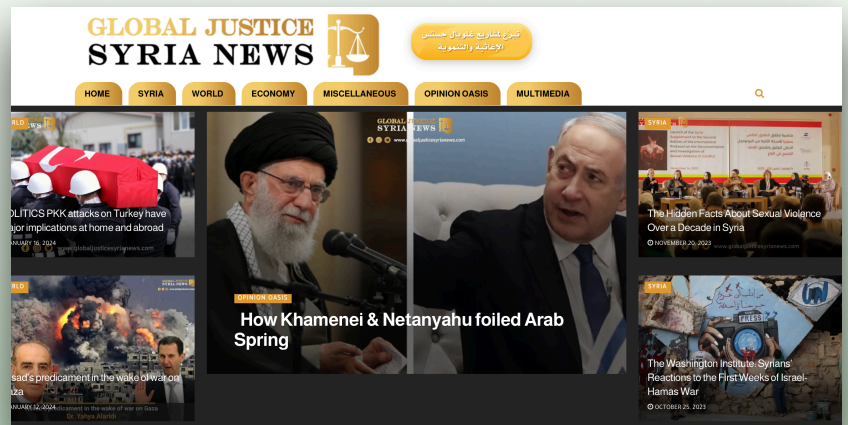

On the 12th anniversary of the outbreak of the Syrian revolution, March 15,(2023) Global Justice launched its comprehensive news website in Arabic and English, “Global Justice Syria News.”

The website quickly turned into a strategic platform for distinguished opinion writers, including experts, ministers, analysts, statesmen, and journalists with illustrious names in the Syrian and Arab arena.

Its effectiveness began to reach the American arena, analyzing and criticizing the work of the Syrian-American lobby in the United States, revealing many details about the nature of its work and its positive and negative aspects.

Global Justice Syria News is distinguished by its ability to penetrate the Syrian arena, in various governorates and areas of influence, relying on a network of editors and correspondents inside Syria and Around the world. Therefore, his video investigations and video reports received a wide presence and spread, exceeding millions of followers.

otton Cultivation

The war, coupled with the years of neglect preceding it, significantly impacted cotton farming in Syria, especially in the Al-Jazeera region known for it. While Syria's cotton produce once reached over a million tons (with Al-Hasaka contributing 50% of this amount), it dwindled to less than 100,000 tons in the years following

2011. The region Global Justice chose, Ras al-Ayn in Northern Syria, heavily relies on cotton farming, with 22% of the household income stemming from it. Our organization is keen on revitalizing this sector and employing both male and female farmers. We also emphasize agricultural education and guidance, ensuring the provision of seeds, fertilizers, and pest control methods.



Beekeeping Projects

Our organization supported a honey production project by establishing an “apiary” in Northern Syria. Syria’s honey production had reached approximately four thousand tons annually, produced by over 680,000 hives. However, in 2020, production was around 700 tons, and the number of hives decreased by 60 percent.

The country’s honey consumption is estimated at 1,500 tons. Syria’s beekeeping wealth was estimated to be about one percent of the global beekeeping wealth before 2011, with the number of beekeepers ranging between 28,000 and 30,000 at that time.

Therefore, our organization believed that enhancing this type of

agriculture-based activity is a good investment, as it introduces an important commodity to the markets and activates skills and expertise among the population. Hence, the Global Justice apiary was established, which is continuously supported and there's an ongoing effort to develop it, increase the number of hives, and initiate similar projects in various areas of Northern Syria.

Livestock Wealth

The abundant production of organized agricultural projects has provided an excess of fodder, motivating our team to launch a sheep breeding project to rejuvenate the livestock wealth. This initiative aims to supply meat and dairy to the residents of Northern Syria and further contribute to employing the workforce.



A s part of its assessment

of the human rights path in Syria, Global Justice was the only Syrian American organization that was invited to the Human Rights Council meeting in Geneva.



Global Justice Olive Oil Mill:

Global Justice supported the operation of olive oil presses in the countryside of Aleppo, a region historically renowned for its production of premium olive oil. We facilitate employment, enhance olive oil production, and promote its widespread sale, thereby providing farmers with favorable conditions both before and after obtaining the oil quantities for marketing. In the Afrin region alone, the number



of olive trees reached 22 million. The revenue from these trees constituted 70% of the income for the residents of this area. Furthermore, the number of olive oil mills and centers in the Afrin region totaled 500.”



Global Justice provided grants to olive farmers in advance to help them care for the trees until harvest time. The organization was able to support the population and encourage them to benefit from olive pulp for heating, instead of expensive fuel.

Educational Initiative

Since its inception, our organization has emphasized the importance of education and the intellectual upbringing of the new generations in Northern Syria. A mandatory requirement set by the organization for its project workers is to ensure their children attend the schools supported by our organization.

Agricultural Projects Water and Green Energy

The Ras Al-Ain area, where our organization establishes its projects, floats atop a sea of abundant groundwater. However, the extraction of this water was recklessly over-exploited due to the mismanagement of Assad regime institutions. This situation persisted for decades until the springs dried up, and the soil became desertified. It was not possible to extract water from the depths of the earth without the use of engines running on fuel. Under current circumstances, fuel is not consistently available, and when it is, its prices are very high. Moreover, the use of fuel inflicts significant environmental damage.

That's why Global Justice considered resorting to alternative energy, green energy, by using solar panels. The idea was implemented in its first project, and when it succeeded, it was applied to subsequent projects.

Currently, Dr. Albizem, along with his partners, is working on establishing a factory to produce solar panels in Turkey. These panels will be supplied to the interior of Syria and global markets. The panels associated with Global Justice are earmarked for charitable work and support the idea of transitioning to green energy.



G lobal Justice, in cooperation with the American Rahbar Organization

carried out a medical campaign in northern Syria to review the conditions of those in need of medical assistance and consultations, and assistance was provided to the population, including women, men and children.



Corn Cultivation

One of the most suitable soil types for corn cultivation is found in Northeast Syria, especially in the Euphrates basin, including the “Ras al-Ain” area, which our organization selected for its agricultural projects.

Global Justice studied the ideal soil for successful corn cultivation in its projects. According to their analysis, the “sandy clay” soil in the northern Syrian lands has a homogenous sedimentary nature. This soil is fertile, well-draining, and aerated. It’s also free from salinity and alkalinity. The fertility of the soil does not only impact the yield but also affects the length of the plant’s growth period. It has been observed that the addition of chemical fertilizers can accelerate the appearance of shoots by 4-10 days.

Yellow corn is an irrigated summer crop. Its time in the ground is relatively short. Taking advantage of this characteristic, the same land can be planted twice a year with two different crops. The seed requirement for a single dunam of corn is between 2.5 – 3 kilograms. The yield from this dunam ranges from 1,500 to 4,000 kilograms of corn.

The delegation also met H. E. Ambassador Korhan KARAKOÇ, General Director of Syria Directorate, who welcomed the continuous cooperation between the organization and the Türkiye government.



Global Justice was invited to participate in the “Madaniyah” conference in Paris. The organization participated with many active humanitarian organizations and trends.

Printing School Books:

Global Justice funded the printing and shipping of thousands of school books to make them available to children in the Rukban camp. This was done in collaboration with the Syrian Emergency Task Force (SETF) and the U.S. Army.



SETF and Global Justice enter a delegation from the US Congress into the liberated north of Syria

SETF, in cooperation with Global Justice, entered a delegation of members of the US Congress into areas controlled by the Syrian opposition in the north of the country, on Sunday morning. The delegation was accompanied by the Executive Director of the Emergency Team, Moaz Mustafa, Dr. Albizem, President of Global Justice, his deputy, Maissa Kabbani, the Head of the Syrian Negotiating Commission, Dr. Badrjamos, and the General Director of Syria TV, Dr. Hamza Mustafa.



The congressional delegation to northwestern Syria included three members, including Republican Party member French Hill, in addition to Senator Scott Fitzgerald and Senator Ben Klein.

The delegation met with a group of Syrian children and visited the coalition headquarters in the region, and participated in the honoring ceremony held by the Global Justice organization this evening in the city of Gaziantep for the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the SETF, Adams, in the presence of many Syrian and Turkish political figures and businessmen.

The second annual conference of Global Justice

- The second annual conference of the Global Justice organization was held in Gaziantep, Turkey, on August 27th, 2023. The event was attended by several members of the U.S. Congress, the U.S.



Ambassador to Turkey, prominent figures in the Turkish Foreign Ministry, and the National Coalition for Syrian Opposition and Revolutionary Forces, in addition to a delegation of Syrian businessmen and journalists. In a humanitarian gesture, the conference honored to a prominent figure known for his support for the Syrian people and the Syrian cause, Jerry Adams, the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Syrian Emergency Task Force organization. Adams was presented with the annual Global Justice Award and the shield of the distinguished Syrian pioneer, Adila Beyham.

Establishing Schools:

Today, Global Justice is working on establishing a school in Ras al-Ayn and building schools in the Rukban camp. It has also committed to monthly salaries for the teachers in these schools. In addition to ensuring proper nutrition for children in the Rukban camp, the organization decided to purchase cows specifically for educational purposes, with the goal of providing daily milk for the children in the schools.



Health care:

Dr. Albizem launched a platform for providing charitable medical consultations on the organization's public website, with his specialized team receiving inquiries from around the world. During his visit to the Rukban camp, he conducted free medical examinations for the residents and collaborated with the SAMS organization to train doctors in northern Syria.

The head of Global Justice visits Al-Rukban camp, deep in Syrian territory:

The head of Global Justice, Dr. Albizem, made a visit to Al-Rukban camp in the eastern countryside of Homs, making him one of the few people to have visited the besieged camp since 2014, and the first specialist doctor to enter it.

Dr. Albizem was accompanied on this visit by the Executive Director of the Syrian Emergency Organization, Moaz Mustafa, and it took place in coordination with the United States of America and the international coalition forces.



President of Global Justice, Dr. Albizem performed free vascular catheterization operations

for 15 patients in northern Syria. Using the latest technologies and advanced treatments such as those offered to American patients. Regarding these operations, Dr. Albizem said that the treatment provided is not available in Syria, and it was applied and explained to local cadres, so that they can benefit from it and apply it later. Dr. Albizem sent a message to all expatriate Syrian doctors, especially American ones, in which he called on them to assume their humanitarian and moral responsibility towards Syria and its people.



The Turkish Embassy in Washington, D.C., held its annual ceremony

on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Turkish Republic, with the participation of Ambassador Murat Mirkan and many political and military figures in the United States,



Maisaa Kabbani, Vice President of the Global Justice Organization, met with the Turkish Ambassador in Washington, D.C., at the celebration of the Turkish Republic Day in October 2023.

in addition to representatives of civil society and the diplomatic corps in Washington. The ceremony was attended by Deputy Uti Kim, First Deputy Assistant Secretary of State. American Council for European and Eurasian Affairs. Global Justice received an invitation to attend the ceremony, where it was represented by Maissa Kabbani, the organization's vice president and project manager, in addition to the participation of many representatives of the Syrian American lobby in the United States.

Engineer Ayman Asfari invited

President of Global Justice, Dr. Albizem and Vice President Maissa Kabbani to a meeting in Washington, DC to discuss the future of cooperation between “Madaniyah” and Global Justice, followed by a working lunch with the participation of representatives of various American-Syrian organizations.



Global Justice's creative policy initiatives

Global Justice, in partnership with the Arab Democratic Alliance, proposed what it called the Syrian-American Initiative, which relied on providing creative solutions for the Syrian future based on their initiative, the “West Germany Scenario.”



Syrian and international political circles and elites received the initiative "Unifying Syria through the West German scenario" with great welcome, and many organizations and political movements joined this initiative, which is being widely discussed in the squares.

large media presence of Global Justice, the organization’s political initiatives have become more powerful, and are being circulated continuously, whether in the corridors of the foreign ministries of countries concerned with the Syrian file, or in the banners of demonstrators in the streets. Syrian.

This attendance culminated in Global Justice's invitation to participate in the first investment conference held in January 2024 in the liberated north of Syria, where major media outlets such as Al Jazeera and others paid attention to what Global Justice put forward in the words of its project manager, Maissa Kabbani, at the conference, when she pointed out: The "Unifying Syria through the West German scenario" initiative received attention at the conference and on social media.
